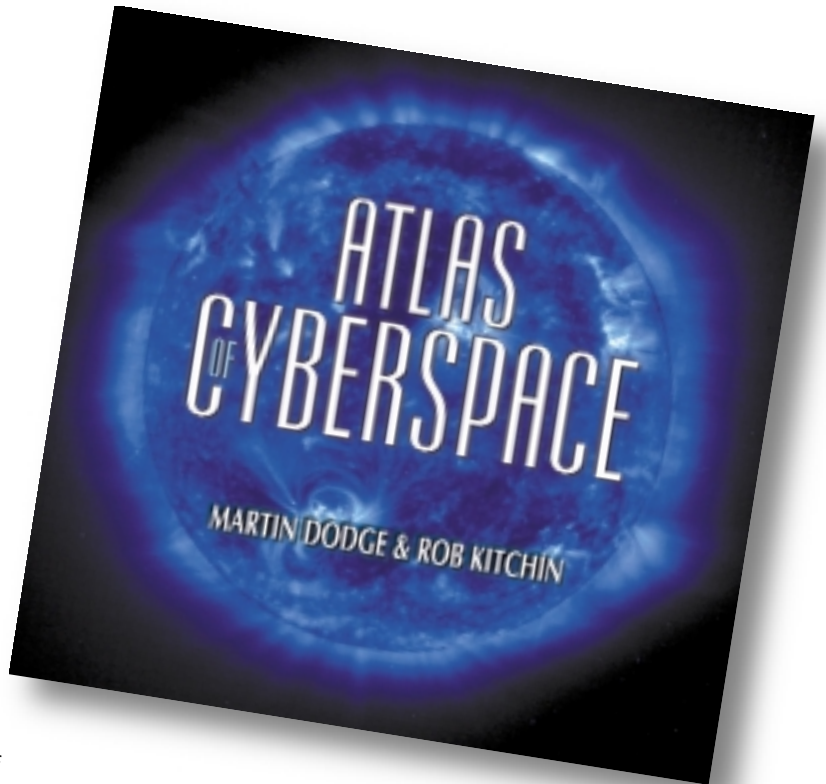

What does cyberspace look like?

This Atlas is the first ever book to explore the true spatial and visual nature of cyberspace and its infrastructure. It uses a user-friendly, approachable style to examine why cyberspace is being mapped and what new cartographic and visualisation techniques have been employed.

Fully illustrated with over 200 full colour images, it catalogues 30 years worth of maps that reveal the rich and varied landscapes of cyberspace, a landscape occupied by some 400 million users.



- Internet infrastructure maps show where the computers are located and how the networks interconnect them and the traffic that flows between them
- Maps of the World Wide Web, detail how the hyperlink structures and contents of websites are mapped to provide informational landscapes
- Examines how social interactions between people e.g using email or chat can be mapped
- Concludes by discussing what artists and writers imagine cyberspace to be like.
