The Biennial will explore the spatial impact of transport and other networks, supplying of resources such as information, materials and energy, and will tackle the challenges they create for spatial planning.

Selected European cities, regions, institutions, NGO's and private companies will exhibit their urban plans, structure plans, development visions, flagship projects and urban designs. These will be included in an exhibition catalogue. A virtual exhibition containing different multimedia and audio-visual material will also be presented.

The 5th Biennial aims to create a meeting point for urban planners, engineers, architects, economists, sociologists, and elected people, as well as public and private entities and non governmental organizations (NGOs) to share questions, experiences and alternative answers on urban planning. Some of the questions that will be explored at the workshops are:

- Is the rise and interconnection of networks at all scales inducing more concentrated or disperse spatial developments?
- How can planners create efficient networks and make them compatible with more sustainable cities?
- How can citizens and neighbourhoods achieve parity of access to the services provided by networks so as to avoid social and spatial exclusion?
- How are urban planners prepared to face the new challenges brought about by new information technologies to everyday planning practices?

These and other questions suggested by European planners will be explored and further developed at four different workshops held during the event followed by a round table.

To what extent have the layout of networks influenced, willingly or not, the city form and the urban structure of the associated metropolitan and regional areas?

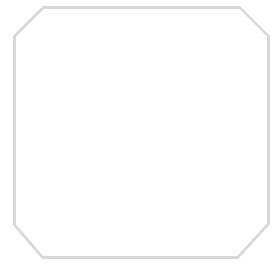

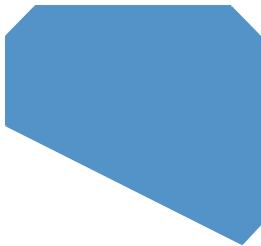
The system theory points out the essential character of networks in the use of the territory.

Whereas the car network has decentralised our cities, and the train-station is used to foster concentration, airports clearly trigger the "poly-centralization" of metropolitan areas.

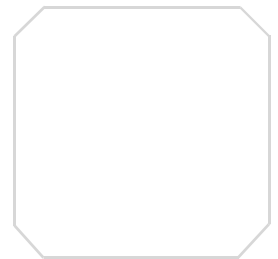
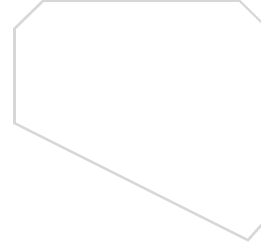


Airport development in the past focused on the airside, neglecting to build a good neighbourhood relationship with the territory it is located in.

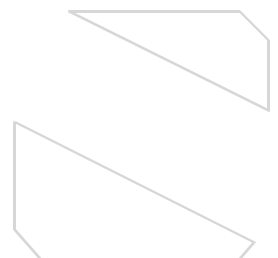
Are networks a suitable solution for cities in a polycentric and heterogeneous region?

Almost every city in Europe over the past 20 years has attempted to reinvent itself.

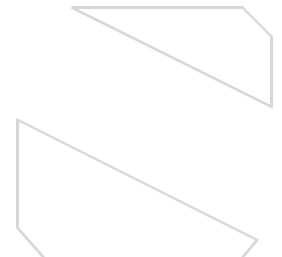


There would be an urban system without an infrastructure of technical networks to support the products, people, info and signs exchange.

The territory is undergoing a new spatial organisation marked by a double process of fragmentation of settlements and individualisation of relations.



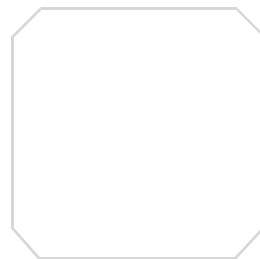
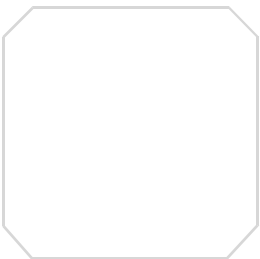
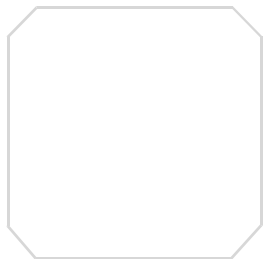
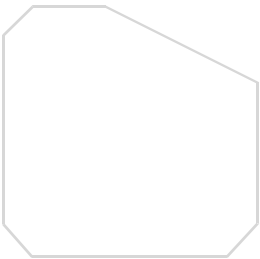
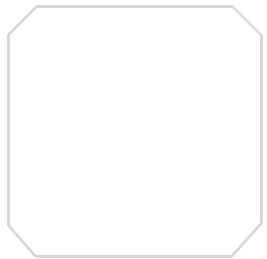

Requires political leadership and a strong responsibility on the part of the Institutions to ensure a consistent approach within a complex system.



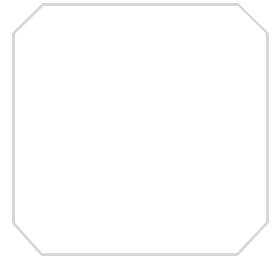
New political stakes for the network society

Depends on implementing policies in a proportionate manner and on taking decisions at the most appropriate level.

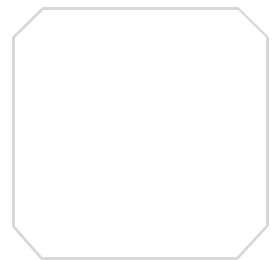
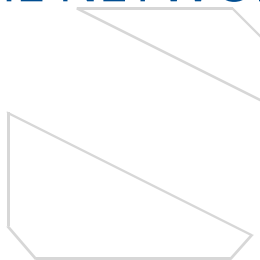
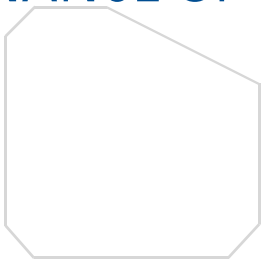
