As part of the BEAR 2003 conference a major debate will take place on future developments in international professional accreditation, chaired by Professor Dennis Lenard of University of Technology, Sydney. Dennis is the immediate past Chairman of the International Cost Engineering Council. He is past national president of the Australian Institute of Quantity Surveyors and the inaugural chairman of the Pacific Association of Quantity Surveyors.

The debate will feature a contrasting set of views on the future of professional accreditation globally. Two paradigms are emerging. One identified as "exclusive", input oriented, aimed at high flyers, and based on performance measures of collaborating partners. The second seen as "inclusive", output oriented, aimed at all with ambition, and based on what is offered and the value it adds rather than who is offering it.
